The graduate from the Institute for European Studies is able to...

### 1. Acquire, maintain and develop knowledge in several fields related to EU studies in order to have a multifaceted reading of a societal phenomenon affecting the EU and to

- Understand the functioning of EU institutions and decision-making process
- Explain the trajectories of current EU events and policies
- Understand the relationship between the abstract character of theories, conceptualizations and their societal implications
- Situate every phenomenon in its EU socio-historical context
- Analyse power relationships within EU institutions and within Member States societies
- Identify the challenges of complex social phenomena
- Understand the dynamics of relationships between actors in different political, economic and social systems in the EU

### 2. Communicate in a written or oral form taking into account the interlocutor and the context of enunciation

- Use abstract concepts in an appropriate manner
- Provide critical arguments and use them to the right purpose
- Be able to quote sources and to elaborate a bibliography following academic criteria
- Elaborate an oral or written argumentation
- Summarise dense or complex material without losing the original sense
- Develop a clear, documented and original argumentation
- Write in a clear, structured and adequate language, based on scientific demonstration
- Be able to take notes and to analyse them

- Embrace other languages and European cultures
- Acquire knowledge of different cultures and ways of living
